There will be an ALA General Membership meeting on Thursday, May 1th at 7:00 p.m. We will be electing delegates for the Department convention at this meeting in May. We will have an ALA Executive Board meeting on May 15th at 7:00 p.m. The 12 District will have their meeting on May. Also, the Division 1 meeting will be held on May. If you plan to attend please let one of the ALA Officers know by April 6th.

Election will be held at out General Membership Meeting on May 1st. All position will be open for nomination. We need our members to step up and take charge. Your voice does count. If no one steps up to be the President of our Unit then the Auxiliary will have to give up their Charter. To be the largest Auxiliary Unit in the State of Texas and then lose our Charter because no one wants to volunteer is very sad. This Auxiliary unit has over 200 local Senior Members who are eligible for any one of the Officers' position available. You will not have to do this alone! There are many Past Unit Presidents who are willing to help mentor and guide our new Officers. But, it is up to you as Members to come to the meeting and decide! So, please plan too attennd this very important Auxiliary General Membership meeting.

I am very proud of my two years as President and wish the President elect success for the coming year. Members, I want to share with you some of the things that our Unit accomplished this past year. We were able to accomplish this from our Unit's proceeds from the Auxiliary dinners / Basket Raffles, Special Program's Dinners, etc;

• Our Unit raised \$10,527 for our Department Cancer Research MD Anderson Scholarship.

- The Unit sent two shipments of care packages to approximately 75 soldiers overseas. Also, we sent seven boxes of coupons to our Military Families to use while overseas. The coupons were valued at \$14,207. These events were for our National Security Program.
- The unit provided 29 individuals that were in need with toys and food at Christmas. Our Unit supported 10 military families. We also supported over 500 Veterans through our Americanism Program
- The Unit collected over 1,052 Marine Toys for Tots valued at \$30,104. We also donated approximately 582 small stuffed animals which were value at \$2,910 to snowball express.
- The unit will send two girls to the Texas Bluebonnet Girls State at the Texas Lutheran University in Seguin, TX in June.
- The Unit assisted four of our members that were in needed of financial assistance. Our members volunteer to prepare food, clean, and take our Veterans to the doctors or hospital.
- The unit raised \$2,500 for our Local Scholarship Program which will provide five girls a \$500 scholarship each. The Legion and SAL also supported the Auxiliary with this program.
- The unit also supported Creative Arts, Past President's Parley and Wounded Warriors and donated \$360 to those programs.
- The unit helped with four memorial service and the Memorial Service at Blue Bonnet Cemetery. We have sent numerous flowers, plants and cards to our own Members. This past year we have lost eight of our beloved sisters.

Get your hats ready! The Auxiliary will have their annual Kentucky Derby Hat Contest on May 3rd. Anyone can participate in the hat contest. Awards will be given out. Please bring finger foods or snacks. We will start at 2:00 p.m. So come on out and have as much fun as we did last year.
