SAL NEWS

Greetings from your Squadron 379. With the recent resignation of our current Commander the Squadron will be holding elections at our next general meeting on September 8th. I encourage all of our members to attend and make your voice known.

To continue with the Squadron Program of the Josh Dogs the Squadron received another letter from Cook Children Hospital on what impact the Dogs are having with the young patients. Here is one such stories: "Two (2) young sisters were in a car accident admitted to the hospital. One of them had more severe injuries than the other, and was down in the intensive care unit. I met her sister who was in slightly better (though not good) shape. I gave her a Josh Dog—she loved him and squeezed him immediately. The next time I came to visit her, I told her that I would be going to visit her sister, and she asked if her sister could have a dog too. I thought that was so sweet of her to want that for her sister. I brought her one, she was unable to move her body much and wasn't speaking or reacting really. Her dad put the Josh Dog next to her in bed and it pretty much stayed there. About a week later, the sister with the lesser injuries had gone home, and the other one was still stuck in bed with injuries. When I was in her room, her sister video chatted from home, and she had her Josh Dog in her lap. The sister who was still here held her Josh Dog up to the phone and said, "look we have the same the dog!" It was the first time I had heard the girl speak since her accident. She is now recovering on our rehab unit and has her Josh Dog sitting in the window."

So our program is working and the young patients are benefitting from it and our Squadron will continue as long as we can.

The Squadron other programs The Food Bank of Tarrant County and Veterans Dog Assistance programs is in full swing and doing worthwhile.

There will be a special election at our next meeting for the position of Squadron Commander. There is a sign-up sheet at the Post.

On September 17th the Squadron will start their SAL Meat Raffle at 2:30 pm so I invite everyone to come

out and attend. Everyone has fun, and if you're a newcomer that is all right come out and see what it's all about.
