approving the establishment of the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier in Arlington National Cemetery. November 11 was chosen for the date of the ceremony. Congress declared on 11/11/1921 a legal Federal holiday to honor who participated in WW1. In the years following came WW2, and the Korean War. And then on 6/1/1954 President Eisenhower signed legislation changing the name of the holiday Armistice Day to Veterans Day. This Veterans Day our nation will be paying homage and respect to all who have served. May the U.S. flag be flown more abundantly than ever.

One of the more favored holidays than others is coming up soon. Thanksgiving will be coming in a few weeks and due to the virus some have decided to miss the big family gatherings in order to try to stay home and safe while others have decided to go for the big gettogether.
