Imagination is our only limitation

Congrats to the completion of the Historical award the post received. Some efforts of our members executive group and others that were instrumental in completion such as Joe Campbell should be recognized. A recent addition to our Riders and someone who I see as a member and friend of Post 379 and generally legion focused, must be thanked for getting this to a conclusion several years in waiting.

Things are looking up, like we have been blessed with some good riding weather, events new and old are being planned. Have you noticed the true partnership going on with our SAL, Aux, Riders and Legionnaires? We hope yall are ready to join us for these events, they are intended for all to enjoy. Watch your Post calendar for all the info.

As A true legionnaire I am Moved to action in something we offer to the public and often work with our scouts to accomplish. Unfortunately, a chain of events has left us short of our goals. FLAG retirement!!! We have one heck of a mess there. I will look to create an event where we can interact with all who care about this, and there are many who have not only noticed but have voiced concerns, we must begin immediately to get volunteers to help with this task. WE as riders and especially those who sensitive about our flag must step up to help get this back under control, any other takers please watch for dates and opportunities to bring this under control. Hopefully we can plead with our associated scout groups to schedule a time to accomplish this in mass and be there to participate . They alone cannot be expected to complete this task. It is monumental. Adults and scouts can get this done way better than the 40-50 flags I personally retired the night before the historical representation last month to clean up and remove from sight this issue. Please, as you see chatter of plans, look within yourself to find ways to participate. The flags to be properly retired must be disassembled prior to being placed into a ceremonial fire. This is where we need much in the volunteering task and yes, the word Monumental applies. Gear that is advised is gloves and masks and less than favorite clothes as some flags have been there for some time and have gotten wet. I found only damp flags and no mold, but we just don't know so dress the

part. If you have health concerns, please support us but stay away from this project.

There is another care here, over the years people have voiced opinions on the location of our storage sheds and I for one feel they very much limit what events can be accommodated in Mahon Park, due to their location in the center of the park. A suggestion of relocation of these to the rear fence Is very possible, not costly and it will open the park for a place for kids to focus their attention with specific activities as well as bringing Scouts more space for their events. This will allow more outdoor events and respect the wishes of families wishing to visit our post that do not want to have or limit their kids time inside. Picture limitless things. Police or fire departments having child bicycle training, home safety or even fire prevention, fire extinguisher training, Scout camping training events or just a day with blow up challenge events getting kids off the electronics and outside for fun. No limit but the imagination. Oh, yes, the point of this, is the flag pile will have to be moved to accomplish this shed relocation and so, I do not want to move them anywhere except the fire pit and they simply cannot be moved out there unless they are ready to be retired immediately. Other things needed to move the building that can be returned after use are things like Standard length steel fence posts used for rolling the shed, Railroad Ties to roll them on, Concrete blocks to keep the sheds off the ground and prevent rot and animals from nesting underneath. Pretty unique supplies that if donated or loaned will help us and will make the project affordable.

I have another request of our membership. If anyone can get a few piles of clean fill. we need to fill a growing hole out by the fire pit. It is a hazard for elders who are less mobile and a curiosity draw for any child or especially after dark with scouts gathering around. With chunks of concrete and other debris that needs to be filled over. This has come to the forefront with the plans for the Auto /bike show and it would be very productive to complete before that from a safety point of view. The post as you know has been co-operative in Membership needs post wide with investments, such as the new Grill (not installed), AC unit replacement and associated roof repair and redesign and extensive updating to Bar systems. I would volunteer to help and agree mightily with a deep clean of our cooking devices while the old Grill is removed from floor to Firehood. Call it a reset or whatever we need too. I use that kitchen enough to know we have needs there to be dealt with.

Other projects holding thoughts is an improvement to our auxiliary's storage area as we Jam that room up so bad with our fund raising activities people are understandably frustrated. There is a lot to uncover there and I am willing to volunteer our riders to assist here with many others I know will jump into that with smiles (I remember the Volunteering that went on with the bar up grades). This will take planning and the approval of our Auxiliary, for it to happen. A design plan on paper is right up my alley and will help all understand and approve or contribute to input. Again, Imagination is our limitation.

Tired of that, let us move on to events we sponsor. An event with our brothers at Sikh riders will give us the chance to donate to their causes as they donate to ours, especially the Cancer event.

Look forward to our Steak dinner on April 5<sup>th</sup>. With the help of our other cooking volunteers, we had a most excellent post meal report from near all diners of a good steak dinner. What a relief. Whew thank heavens. We are working with our long-time supplier of Chicken fried steaks to supply our steaks as well at an affordable price, with an expected excellent product that keeps people coming to their restaurant. Joes Café on Irving BLVD in Irving has been instrumental in the success of our chicken fried steaks supply. Look em up and try them if you would please and if you do mention the Legion so they know we support them as well.

We are committed to an escort of our friends at The Thin Blue line who are both rider members and Legion friends. The passing of one member's father, who was military is our Mission. SFC Lloyd McGuire will be escorted to his final place of rest on April 8<sup>th</sup> from our post by the Thin Blue Line and your post riders, as you know we enjoy a great relationship with our brothers at the local community police forces. If you are not aware they visit our post frequently and assist in our efforts of raising funds for our benefactors.
