Before Anna Jarvis worked to get a day just for recognizing mothers, her own mom played an important role uniting woman for good causes. Mama Jarvis—also known as Ann Reeves Jarvis—cared for wounded soldiers on both sides of the field during the Civil War, and in its aftermath, she organized a "Mothers' Friendship Day," the goal of which was to foster reconciliation between former Union and Confederate soldiers by having them come together,

along with mothers from both sides. With the senior Jarvis' lifelong focus on caring for children and promoting peace, it's no wonder her daughter fought for a day just for moms.

On May 9, 1914, President <u>Woodrow Wilson</u> issues a presidential proclamation that officially establishes the first national <u>Mother's Day</u> holiday to celebrate America's mothers.
